


Gallery/Studio Program Scholarship Application Form

We are pleased to offer a limited number of scholarships for the Gallery/Studio Program for students ages six to seventeen. Please make sure to include all seven parts of the application. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Drop-Off Hours for Scholarship Applications

August 17–September 13

Wednesdays–Sundays, 11 a.m.–6 p.m.

Museum is closed Monday and Tuesday.

Applications may be dropped off at the Visitor Center or in the Education Gallery. Be sure to pick up a receipt for your scholarship application. **To find out if you have been awarded a scholarship, you must call the Education Division at (718) 501-6230 on September 18. If the Education Division does not receive confirmation that you accept the scholarship, directly or by voicemail, within 7 days of the call-in period, your scholarship will be rescinded.** The Museum will not notify recipients; the responsibility to call lies with the applicant. In order to be considered for a scholarship, applicants must submit this completed form along with the items listed below.

1. Statement of Interest

Describe why you would like to be a student in the Gallery/Studio Program and why you should receive a scholarship. Our expectations are age-appropriate, and we ask students to write their own letters. Typed letters are accepted but not encouraged. Attach the statement to this application.

2. Letter of Recommendation

This should be a current letter describing the specific art-related and distinguishing merits of the applicant. It cannot be written by a member of the Museum's staff or the applicant's family. This letter may or may not be returned. **Attach the letter to this application and indicate on the letter the writer's contact information and relation to the applicant.**

3. Portfolio

Although scholarships are not awarded based solely on artistic merit, the portfolio should represent the interest, effort, and creativity of the applicant. The portfolio is a package (folder, binder, or envelope) of eight to ten original and diverse works of art. No three-dimensional work, such as sculptures or framed pieces, is allowed, although photographs of three-dimensional work are accepted. If you are unable to compile works of art that demonstrate the student's commitment, please include a letter explaining how the student will benefit from taking the art class. Label the portfolio with the applicant's name and age. **All portfolios, regardless of result, must be picked up between September 23 and December 4, or they will be discarded.**

4. Financial Information Form

Please fill out the Financial Information Form below and attach it with your application. Scholarships are awarded based in part on financial need. In order to assess this need, we require the Information Form to be filled out in full. All information is confidential.
